3. 1 vase, 5 stems, 1 or more cultivars

**DIVISION II – LARGE CUPPED**

4. 1 Specimen stem
5. 2 vases, 2 cultivars, 3 stems each vase (**double points**)
6. 1 vase, 5 stems, 1 or more cultivars

**DIVISION III – SMALL CUPPED**

7. 1 Specimen stem
8. 2 vases, 2 cultivars, 3 stems each vase (**double points**)
9. 1 vase, 5 stems, 1 or more cultivars

**DIVISION IV – DOUBLE**

10. 1 Specimen stem
11. 2 vases, 2 cultivars, 3 stems each vase (**double points**)
12. 1 vase 5 stems, 1 or more cultivars

**MINIATURE**

13. 1 Specimen stem
14. 1 vase, 5 stems, 1 or more cultivars

24. 1 vase, WALLFLOWERS, 5 stems
25. 1 vase, POLYANTHUS, 3 stems
26. A specimen CAMELLIA bloom
27. 1 vase, HEATHERS, 6 stems
28. 1 vase, ANY 5 FLOWERS FROM BULBS or CORMS (except daffodils)
29. 1 vase, from ANY FLOWERING TREE or SHRUB, can contain items from more than one tree or shrub
30. 9 blooms PANSIES/VIOLAS exhibited on a plate
31. 1 vase, SPRING FLOWERS, arranged for all round effect (rim of vase not to exceed 6" diameter)
32. 1 CACTUS or other SUCCULENT (not exceeding 9" pot)
33. 1 POT PLANT, FLOWERING (not exceeding 9" pot)
34. 1 POT PLANT, FOLIAGE (not exceeding 9" pot)
35. 1 POT PLANT, PRIMULA(not exceeding 9" pot)
36. 1 POT PLANT, SAINTPAULIA (African Violet)
37. 5 HELLEBORE BLOOMS, floating in a bowl of water (1 or more cultivars)

44. 1 CABBAGE
45. 2 LEEKS
46. ANY OTHER VEGETABLE (as per RHS Guide)
