OPEN CLASSES – SWEET PEAS

Class

1. 3 vases, distinct cultivars, 7 sprays of each
2. 1 vase, white or cream, one cultivar, 5 sprays
3. 1 vase, pink, one cultivar, 5 sprays
4. 1 vase, lavender or mauve or blue, one cultivar, 5 sprays
5. 1 vase, cerise or magenta or crimson or scarlet, one cultivar, 5 sprays
6. 1 vase, any colour, one cultivar, 5 sprays
7. 1 vase, mixed, 12 sprays

SECTION A - SWEET PEAS

8. A vase of not less than 12 stems of most fragrant SWEET PEAS, judged on fragrance
9. THE A.T. HUTCHINSON CUP CLASS – A BOWL of SWEET PEAS.
A bowl of not more than 24 stems with any foliage. To be viewed all round and judged for quality and decorative effect. (Bowl not supplied)
10. A vase of up to 12 stems of SWEET PEAS –NOT GROWN ON CORDONS
11. A vase of 5 stems of SWEET PEAS - NOT GROWN ON CORDONS

SECTION B –ROSES

12. A bowl of ROSES (to be viewed from the front and judged for quality and decorative effect. Bowl not supplied)
13. 1 vase, 5 LARGE FLOWERED ROSES, one or more cultivars
14. 1 vase, 3 LARGE FLOWERED ROSES, one cultivar
15. 1 vase, MINIATURE ROSES, 3 stems, one or more cultivars
16. 1 vase, CLUSTER FLOWERED ROSES, 3 stems, one or more cultivars
17. 1 Specimen ROSE, any type
18. 1 vase, SHRUB ROSES, 3 stems, one or more cultivars
19. 1 vase Roses, 3 Stems - 1 stem bud, 1 stem semi open, 1 stem fully open, one cultivar

*Note: Large Flowered Roses – Hybrid Tea type
Cluster Flowered Roses – Floribunda type*

SECTION P –GARDEN PINKS

20. 1 stem, GARDEN PINK, SINGLE, any cultivar
21. 1 stem, GARDEN PINK, DOUBLE, any cultivar
22. 3 stems, GARDEN PINKS, SINGLE, 1 or more cultivars
23. 3 stems, GARDEN PINKS, DOUBLE, 1 or more cultivars
24. 2 vases of 3 stems, GARDEN PINKS, 2 distinct cultivars (**double points**)

SECTION C - OTHER FLOWERS AND PLANTS

Class

27. 2 kinds of HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS, 1 vase of each kind containing 6 stems or sprays (**double points**)
28. 1 Specimen DELPHINIUM
29. 1 vase, SWEET WILLIAMS, 5 stems
30. 9 PANSY/VIOLA blooms exhibited on a plate
31. 1 vase, MIXED FLOWERS arranged for all-round effect, rim of vase not to exceed 6" diameter
32. 6 FUCHSIA blooms in Box or Pan, 1 cultivar
33. 6 FUCHSIA blooms in Box or Pan, 2 or more cultivars
34. 3 CLEMATIS blooms exhibited on plate
35. 1 vase of 4 kinds of HERBS
36. 1 vase of 5 HOSTA leaves
37. 1 vase of 5 FERN leaves
38. 1 vase of MIXED GRASSES AND/OR WILDFLOWERS
39. 1 POT PLANT, FLOWERING (not exceeding a 9" pot)
40. 1 POT PLANT, FOLIAGE (not exceeding a 9" pot)
41. 1 POT PLANT, CACTUS OR SUCCULENT (not exceeding a 9" pot)
42. 1 POT PLANT, PELARGONIUM
43. 1 POT GROWN FUCHSIA (pot not to exceed 9")

Classes 62 and 63, not to exceed 20" wide x 20" deep x 30" high, alcoves provided.
