### **Singing Workshop**

## **Ukraine Ride**

Sunday 8th January New Year Ride for Ukraine

CVBA has been organising the New Year Ride for around twenty years and this year we decided to do something slightly different and raise money for the World Horse Welfare Ukraine Appeal.

With the forecast due to be truly awful, the Ride was nearly cancelled the day before but we dug in our heels and, wow, we are so pleased we did.



We turned up not knowing how many people would show but we had nothing to worry about. Amazingly, around 25 horses and their riders turned up, despite the clouds getting darker before our very eyes.

Julia from The Plough in Belsize laid on hot sausage rolls, mulled wine, hot chocolate and lots of other goodies for the riders and those who came to support on foot. It was quite a sight seeing so many supporters for such a deserving cause. We had timed 'ride off' to perfection (she says, sarcastically). Just as we headed off the wind and rain started but that wasn't about to ruin our fun. We had 20 for the 'Fast' ride led by Nicola Park and five chose the calmer option for a ride around Chipperfield woods. We had no takers this time for the 'Medium' ride, unfortunately due to a lack of horses (very unreliable beasties)

The weather was not kind for the duration, but this didn't dampen spirits or the enthusiasm. In fact, we think it made it more fun. Horses and riders had the best time riding out together as a group and new friendships were formed. There are now very few riding schools that serve the area, so it was a good opportunity to meet new people and those who, maybe, don't get a chance to ride out in company.

Special thanks go to *Julia* for hosting us, *Sandie Payne* who helped to collect the donations, and to *Angela Kemp* (ex CVBA Chairman) who started the collection with a generous donation, even without a horse!

With everyone's generosity we managed to raise £200 for the Ukraine Appeal and a cheque is on its way to the charity.

CVBA was formed in 1973 to make local roads safer for both horse and rider. Membership starts from as little as £2 per month to support safe off-road riding in the area. nurse and child carer. She worked in a Barnado's home before marriage and after her children were born she worked in the nursery school in Kings Langley. She also helped out when the Mount Prison ran a creche for the children of visiting mothers

Bridget and Richard loved walking and knew every footpath in the area. They enjoyed watching the wildlife. Holidays were very important to them and one of their favourite places was the Scilly Isles.

Bridget loved her home and garden. Cooking produce from her well stocked garden was important. Bunches of daffoldils were often picked to decorate the church on Mothering Sunday. As outings got less easy for her she was happiest when she was at home surrounded by her many treasures and she could enjoy looking through her holiday photos and records of events in her life. She had a very strong faith and church was always a vital part of her life. Latterly, even though it was a struggle, she was determined to make it and when she couldn't and the service was live streamed, one of her carers kindly downloaded it for her. She had regularly attended a church home group. She lived out her faith and supported and visited many people when she was well enough. She visited Olive Taylor and Daphne Pritchard on a weekly basis and hated it when she could no longer visit. She was very community minded; she delivered Chipperfield News and was a Poppy Collector for many years. She was an active member of the WI and served on the committee and often won competition prizes. She was also a member of the Mothers' Union and with them served afternoon teas at the Abbey.

Bridget could only remain at home with the faithful support of her carers/helpers and neighbours. Cheryl and Denise were long time loyal and committed home helps but they became her dedicated carers. The love and support they gave her beyond normal activities was wonderful. Extra help from Social Services enabled her to continue living in her much loved home.

Family were so important to Bridget and, as David lived in America and Lynda in Liverpool, it was all the more special when they and their families could visit.

Bridget was a special person and she will be missed not only by her family but by all her friends as well.

### **Parish Council Update February 2023**

On behalf of the village and Parish Council, we would like to thank a donor for their kind and generous gift towards the replacement of the blighted box hedge around the War Memorial.

Herts CC and two utility companies are planning significant road and utility works in and around Chipperfield which will affect traffic and pedestrians. Apart from usual maintenance repairs, there are two major utility projects running concurrently in and around Chipperfield which will cause intermittent full or partial road closures. These will be over an extended period. Herts CC have issued blanket approval for sections of highway for a period of 18 months to avoid having to issue individual notices for each section of works, but this does not mean that roads will be closed for that amount of time. The approval requires pre-warning signs to be displayed in advance of each section of work where traffic control or complete closure is necessary, with the sign specifying the dates. The works include the replacement of old iron gas piping with modern yellow plastic gas piping (Cadent) and installation of fibre telecom cables (Openreach).

I am sorry to say that due to rising costs associated with looking after the village and running the Parish Council, we are proposing a modest rise in the precept raised from each household alongside the council tax bill. The rise in percentage terms appears large but in real terms it amounts to approximately 16p per week based on a Band D property. We hope this rise will not cause too much hardship to householders.

The continuing SANG (Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace) discussions have led us to form a working party of villagers and councillors to develop strategies with Dacorum (DBC) to ameliorate the impact of the SANG proposal on our village. As we still have the option to influence how it will affect our Common, we would like to reiterate our invitation to all parishioners to join the working party.

If you would like to help, actively contribute or raise questions with our joint villager/CPC working group, please let the Parish Clerk know.

Until we can motivate DBC to attend to the ponds, can we please ask the public, and especially dog owners, to stop adding sticks and wood debris to the ponds.

We are still open to receive nominations for our Chipperfield Outstanding Service Award scheme to celebrate an individual's outstanding contribution to the village or village life. We will announce the award at the Annual Parish Meeting in May. Please report all potholes directly to Herts Highways as the more reports they receive, the more likely it is they will be dealt with.

Parking issues remain in the village with roads, access and footpaths being blocked. Please be mindful of others and park safely and responsibly.

#### **Planning Applications**

The local planning authority for Chipperfield is Dacorum Borough Council (DBC). Your Parish Council is a statutory consultee and has a planning committee that meets every three weeks. The committee seeks to reflect the views of the community in its response and comments to DBC. Any resident of Chipperfield may comment about planning applications affecting the village using DBC's online planning portal as well as informing the Parish Council of her/his opinions.







#### **OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE SAVIOUR RC CHURCH**

Spring has arrived. Hurrah! Now we can move from dark days to lighter ones and cold days to warmer ones. I love Spring as the flowers bloom, the birds sing and trees and bushes start to bud. It's a good time to witness and be inspired by God's creation.

This year Lent began on 22 February. The fourth Sunday of Lent, 19 March, is known as 'Laetare Sunday'. Our priests only wear rose vestments twice during the liturgical year - on the third Sunday of Advent and the fourth Sunday of Lent. Rose is worn on these days to show joy and love as we await Christ's coming - both His birth and His Resurrection. Laetare (meaning rejoice) Sunday is the Church's way of giving us a boost as we approach the darkness and distress of Passiontide and Holy Week. It's an opportunity to appreciate what awaits us on Easter Sunday - the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead and the joy his salvation has brought us.

The gospel for that Sunday tells of the encounter between Jesus and a blind beggar whose sight he restores. As the story develops, light dawns, and the beggar slowly becomes aware of just who gave him back his sight. In our own lives, we sometimes struggle through uncertainty and times of darkness. We can worry about money, relationships, health, work and even growing old. Coping with the death of a loved one is one of the hardest things most people go through. We wonder if we'll ever see the light at the end of the tunnel. We hope that Jesus will give us the grace to see more clearly and provide us with the light to guide us through the bad times.

On Laetare Sunday each year we also celebrate Mothering Sunday. Mothering Sunday originally was a feast of the Church, celebrating the 'Mother Church', drawing her children back to home and to attend the church in which they were baptised. It has now developed into the more commercial 'Mothers' Day'. A day when we show our appreciation with flowers, presents and cards. We remind ourselves of the unconditional love of mothers to their children and children's love for their mothers. This day is also for mothers who are no longer with us but whose memory we always cherish. We are also reminded

of our heavenly Mother, Mary, and the very special place she has as the mother of the Son of God. In fact, we wouldn't be observing Lent or the joy of the resurrection without the motherhood of Mary. Christ's birth and our salvation were only made possible by Mary's humble response to the words of the Angel Gabriel: "I am the Lord's servant; may it happen to me as you have said." (Luke 1:38).

We thank God for the gift of all mothers.

### My Big Garden Bird Watch

The last weekend of January is always the time for the RSPB's Big Garden Bird Watch when everyone is asked to watch the birds in their garden for an hour and report the sightings back to the Society. I had missed doing it for a couple of years and thought it would be interesting to see what birds came to the new bird table. The view from my breakfast table takes in the feeders that my mum used to watch, the wildlife pond, as well as a bird's eye view of the new bird table. So, I set myself up with a pad and pen, binoculars, a pot of tea and lots of toast and marmalade. In case anything interesting happened at the pond, I put the telescope in the living room at the ready.

The new table was very well used. The most frequent visitors were Great tits; 4 individuals made a total of 35 visits. A pair of Nuthatches were constantly back and forth, then I realised there were 2 pairs who made 23 visits. Bluetits were plentiful as well as Coal tits, while a pair of Bullfinches stayed in the Prunus tree, eating the buds. A Great Spotted Woodpecker came to mum's feeder; it was always her favourite visitor. The grass in front of the wildlife pond was full of birds which turned out to be Redwings, 8 in total.

Towards the end of the hour things slowed a bit but it was then that the pond got busy with bathers. A couple of Fieldfares had a very splashy time followed by a steady stream of Blackbirds. They all like the same spot, right on the top waterfall where it's quite shallow. Apart from the Fieldfares, most birds bathed on their own, a queue forming in the dogwood bush to the side.

The time passed very quickly; 18 different species were spotted, not a bad total, but not

Greenfinches or Siskins which were always on our list when our son was little. The only green birds were the Parakeets! The new bird table is a great success; its position just right for breakfast viewing and more uplifting than reading the paper!
