## **Weekend of Classical Delights**

To round off its Coronation celebration, Chipperfield was treated to two excellent concerts on 20 and 21 May. St Paul's Church played host to the **Bowfiddle Players** on Sunday evening in a programme including two double violin concertos (Vivaldi and Bach, with soloists Rebecca and Miffy Hirsch) plus Bach's Brandenburg Concerto no 3 and Air on the G string, and Mozart Divertimento No.1. These were all regular concert pieces, but to signify that this was a British coronation, we also heard Purcel's Rondeau (on which Britten's famous variations was based), Elgar's Serenade for strings, Holst's St Paul's suite and Karl Jenkins' Paladio, all topped off with Piazzola's Libertango - a fantastic programme, surely including everyone's favourites. Bowfiddle is a group of professional string players, including some local celebrities, who have played in a glittering array of venues (including Buckingham Palace) and who perform to the highest standards, but without the need of a conductor—emphasising the chamber music nature of their repertoire. The evening was packed with delights and the performances truly inspiring.

And to launch the musical weekend, on Saturday afternoon **Yasmin Strevens-Chen** gave a solo recital in the Parish Room, accompanied by the piano of **Winnie Wu**, both performers having family connections from Hong Kong and China and both having studied at the Royal Academy of Music. Their programme started with the Allemande from Bach's solo partita No 2 followed by Greig's popular Sonata No 3, a work full of drama and melody, and Reverie by the English composer Angela Morley. To conclude the recital Yasmin played the solo and fearsomely difficult Zigeunerweisen (Gypsy airs) of Pablo Sarasate. Yasmin clearly has a brilliant solo career ahead of her and we were fortunate to host her recital.





#### **OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE SAVIOUR RC CHURCH**

The weather is warmer, we can smell freshly mown grass, garden centres are really busy and the ice cream vans are making their rounds. Summer is here!

I recently injured my right eye and after a few days of me dithering, my daughter drove me to Watford A and E. It wasn't too busy when we sat in the waiting room but gradually all the seats began to fill. Some complaints were obvious - a couple of broken arms and one leg, a bleeding toe and a bleeding leg, babies with high temperatures, a road accident and even an overdose.

After four and a half hours my name was called. The lovely nurse kept apologising for the waiting time but I told her it wasn't her fault. The doctors and nurses work so hard. She asked what I had done to my eye. I explained I had been on a ladder pulling ivy off a fence. She was totally horrified that a lady of my advanced years should be climbing on a ladder. "You could have fallen off and broken your arm", she said. Anyway, orange dye was put in my eye and after a thorough examination a large scratch - a corneal abrasion - was diagnosed. I was given antibiotic cream to administer for five days and a warning to keep away from ladders!

Health care today is a wonderful combination of science and technology. I am sure all of us have benefited from the advances of medicine. I began to think how Jesus healed and performed miracles 2000 years ago. He couldn't take blood, run tests or Xray people. Gospel stories show how Jesus was regularly stirred to touch and heal those who were physically hurting: the sick, the lame, the lepers, etc.

For example, He cured the blind man by spitting on the ground, making some mud and putting it on the man's eyes. A man with a serious skin disease came and bowed down in front of Jesus and with one touch his skin disease disappeared. Even Peter, sinking in the sea as he tried to walk to Jesus across the water, was caught when Jesus reached out his hand. By his example, Jesus calls us all to reach out and offer help and hope to others, if we can. We may think we don't have healing hands, as such, but then the simple act of touching someone, talking or calling and showing understanding and compassion is healing in a way, isn't it?

Whilst housebound I received gifts of grapes and flowers (plus superior safety goggles from my son!). I have had messages and calls from friends with offers of help. Being normally fit I have been moved and 'touched' by their concern. It reminded me of the quote by St Teresa of Avila: "Christ has no body on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassionately on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world."

## **Damsels and Dragons Galore**

This seems to be a very good year for dragonflies and damselflies. They were a little late arriving but at the end of May, in just one night, a dozen climbed up the irises at the edge of the swimming pond and performed their miraculous magic trick. They leave the water as rather ferocious looking nymphs and, as the sun rises, burst out of their crispy outer casing and, as they warm, beautiful gossamer wings fill with blood and they begin their adult lives.

They will have spent at least a year in the pond eating just about anything that moves, the big Emperors between two and five years. Now is their time in the sun, a dash to find a mate and ensure there is a generation to follow.

I sit spellbound as two male Emperors whizz back and forth, occasionally chasing one another. A closer look down at the water and two of the less brightly coloured females

are laying eggs. These are the Hawker type, constantly on the move hunting the tiny insects over the water. From an old loosestrife stem, an orangey brown Four-spotted chaser darts across the pond to catch his meal. He prefers to lie in wait on a favourite perch and pounce on his dinner. The reeds around the edge of the pond are full of bright blue damselflies, most of them seem to be mating. The damsels will only live for a couple of weeks, while the dragons may last a couple of months, if they are lucky.

They don't seem to mind me swimming just below them, and

I look for more empty cases as I go round and round like a goldfish in a bowl. Every day now there seem to be more; the ponds are like a busy airport with flights coming in and out.

On a warm summer's day there is nowhere else I would rather have my lunch: so much to see, the ever changing flowers, birds coming for a drink or a bath, and one of nature's greatest miracles, the transformation from ugly water creature to superb flying machine all in one night! Wendy Bathurst


