D-Day Commemoration

BOVINGDON'S Beacon Brazier will be lit on Thursday 6 June to commemorate the 8oth Anniversary of the D-Day Landings.

It will be only the second time the brazier has been lit since it was installed for the Platinum Anniversary of her late Majesty the Queen and it now stands proudly on Bovingdon Green as a lasting legacy to her memory. The Brazier will be lit at **9.15pm** by County Councillor Richard Roberts who represents Chipperfield and Bovingdon and is also leader of Herts County Council. The official D-Day Tribute will be read just prior to lighting the brazier.

During the evening a Bovingdon Cricket Club team will play a friendly match against The Grove, starting

at 6pm. The Cricket Club bar will be open and the regular weekly visiting Howe & Co fish and chip van will be serving supper - Thursday 6th is also National Fish and Chip Day.

The event is being organised by Bovingdon Parish Council and the village community events team. Bovingdon Parish Council Chairman, Graham Barrett, said, "It will be a commemoration not a celebration, a time for reflection honouring all those who were involved in this momentous event".

Representatives of the Chipperfield and Bovingdon sub-branch of Hemel Hempstead Royal British Legion have also been invited to attend. We would also like our neighbours from Chipperfield to join us. D-Day pins will be available.

The last match of our current indoor short mat bowls season is almost here. What a really great time it has been for the companionship, competition and that feeling of being with like minded people on a weekly basis.





A reflection on Lent

Advent is a time of waiting and preparation for Christ's birth; Lent is a time of penitential preparation for Christ's death on the cross and resurrection.

Many of us will have enjoyed Pancake Day and then marked Lent by abstaining from chocolate or another personal luxury for forty days, as Jesus fasted in the desert and endured the temptations of Satan. We end our Lent on Easter Sunday with Easter egg hunts and gatherings with family and friends.

This year, along with a group from Holy Cross and St Paul's, I took part in a Lent course. Each week we met to learn about prayer using our Lord's Prayer as the basis to reflect on the elements of Adoration, Petition, Intercession, Unanswered Prayer, Contemplation, Listening and Spiritual Warfare.

This was way outside my comfort zone. However, I was challenged and committed myself to experiencing something new.

The culmination of the course was a 'Soaking'. With little knowledge and some trepidation of what to expect, we met at St Paul's with duvets, blankets and pillows. We started by laying on the floor, a cellist played sounds that reverberated around the room and the floor whilst we all focused on prayer. Each of us experienced it differently. I felt the tumultuous, epic nature of the mountains, through to the flow of the tide or the rhythm of breath, into a final dawn or awakening. To my surprise I was totally immersed and couldn't wait to share my experience with others.

I gained so much by experiencing this period of Lent with a focus which made me consider and have a better understanding of the true meaning of Easter. The message that resonated was that by dying Christ took away our sin and through his resurrection gave us eternal life

How ever you celebrated Easter, I hope you feel renewed and energised along with the 'Darling Buds of May'.

OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE SAVIOUR RC CHURCH

The merry month of May. As a child growing up in Chipperfield I can remember the excitement of going to Sarratt Fair at the beginning of every May. The innocent delight of riding on the carousel and dodgem cars or trying to win a coconut or a goldfish. This was, of course, way before the advent of today's theme parks such as Alton Towers, Thorpe Park, Legoland, etc. What else do you associate with May? Maypole, May Queen, May blossom? Even Mayday! Mayday, repeated three times, has become the global radio signal for help that is used mostly by aircraft and boats to warn of distress and possible lifethreatening emergencies. We always pray we won't hear it said when we are off on our travels!

Forty days after Easter the Church celebrates the Ascension of the Lord into Heaven. The feast of Pentecost is then celebrated 10 days afterwards - this year on 19 May. The apostles returned to Jerusalem after Jesus' Ascension and met in the same Upper Room where they had celebrated the Last Supper. Jesus had asked the apostles to remain there in prayer until the coming of the Holy Spirit. Were they scared and fearful, I wonder? Did they want to shout 'Mayday' three times? Yet after the appearance of the Holy Spirit, on that first Pentecost, we read of a remarkable transformation in the apostles no longer fearful but full of courage, energy and enthusiasm. They had been entrusted with the mammoth task of conveying Jesus' message to all nations. They were the witnesses to Christ's presence on earth so they immediately went into the streets and told everyone about Jesus, his teaching and what he had achieved through his life, death and resurrection. Amazingly, people of all lands and languages understood what they were saying. The apostles' firm commitment to their mission laid the foundation for the spread of Christianity

worldwide. Initially, Christian communities began to form and, where the apostles could not be physically present, they sent letters to convey their knowledge and understanding. They did undertake remarkable missionary journeys, too, even in the face of persecution and martyrdom. We now take for granted how easy it is to travel from one country to another but obviously this was at a time when there was limited transport, no mobile phones and without the other many wonders of twenty-first century technology! History tells us that John, who lived to a ripe old age, was the only one of the original apostles who was not put to death for his faith. Their dedication to spreading the message of Jesus Christ was so inspirational that Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the Christian Church. There is no doubt that the world has changed since Jesus embarked on his earthly ministry, two thousand years ago. Yet the Gospel is just as significant today. Over the centuries, Christianity has grown in numbers as it has spread around the world. The apostles showed their faith by their assertiveness, their bravery, and their readiness to sacrifice all for the cause of Jesus Christ. What a wonderful example they set to all who followed them.

Spring Sunshine!

After such a wet winter a nice sunny day is a welcome treat, even more so when the first Yellow Brimstone butterfly of the season flutters across the garden.

They spend the winter as adults hiding in thick vegetation, waiting for a sunny day to start feeding on nectar and looking for a mate. They are quite large butterflies with wings shaped like leaves; strong fliers that can whizz over a hedge and be gone in the blink of an eye. The garden is full of primroses just now and I tried to take a photo of one butterfly feeding but, in an instant, it was gone! The males are a rich yellow colour but the females are more of a pale green with a bright orange spot on the back of the wing. They will soon be looking for a buckthorn bush on which to lay their eggs but I

hope to see them in the garden for a few weeks.

On Tom's afternoon walk we saw our first orange tip butterfly; we get quite a lot of these as there is a lot of garlic mustard, cuckoo flower and honesty in the garden on which they lay their eggs. The caterpillars will feed on these plants then pupate in the summer and spend winter as a pupa before emerging in the spring to start the cycle of life all over again.

Dilly the sheep had a lovely pair of lambs, quite unusually at 10 in the morning; they seem to have them at dawn or dusk. At 9-30 she was under a tree pawing the ground and trying to get herself comfortable so I went back to check on her half an hour later and she was cleaning up the second one. Good sized lambs, one of each. It's lovely to see them all skipping about. Although there is a couple of weeks difference in age, all four run 'wacky races' in the early evening, whizzing up and down the paddock before suddenly flopping down for a rest before going off again. Sometimes it's hard to get on with the jobs in the garden as they are such a joy to watch. Wendy Bathurst
