On her return at the age of 24 she worked at the Royal Free Hospital as an occupational therapist where she met John. In December 1971 they were married in St Paul's Church, Chipperfield, and spent many happy years at Breeze Cottage.

Maggie loved all wildlife in her garden and fed everything that appeared on her terrace, including stray cats.

Maggie and John enjoyed days out; a particular interest was watching polo. She enjoyed having her nieces and nephews visit and having lunch with them at the Windmill pub in the village. She also enjoyed horse riding with friends. She was a frequent organist at Elmfield Church in Pinner where she met up with her family.

Dovizhdane Yovi

Yovi (of Yovi's Kitchen) came to England 13 years ago as a trained chef, and after graduating she worked as a Food Safety and Health and Safety Officer.

In 2019 she set up Yovi's Kitchen in our village, healthy meals cooked in her commercial kitchen for home delivery; a few months later along came Covid which increased demand for home

deliveries. Yovi and Ellis set up an Outreach Team, had 1,000 leaflets printed and, with some volunteers, delivered to all of Chipperfield in one evening. Demand grew rapidly and after contact from Mark Jarrad and Phil Waine, Yovi, Ellis and their 40 helpers linked in with Chipp Care.

Their next idea was the free freshly baked bread and hot soup deliveries, especially to people living on their own - who enjoyed a chat on the doorstep almost as much as the soup and bread. They also made a Tuesday and Thursday run to the pharmacy in Kings Langley to collect the medicines for addresses in the Chipperfield area. As the restrictions on leaving home were lifted, so the demand for soup and meals reduced and people were establishing their own support networks.

And then Ukraine was invaded. Yovi's hometown in Bulgaria where her parents live is 20 miles from the Romanian frontier and 300 from Odessa and western Ukraine; those fleeing reached the Romanian-Bulgarian border in their hundreds and, while there was international aid in Romania to help them, there was nothing set up in Bulgaria. "No winter clothes, no

food, and no money", Yovi heard from her mother - and so she began collecting here. Money, food, clothes, 90% sourced in Chipperfield. Colin, her partner, with the help of family and friends sourced special clothing and body armour for 6 Ukrainians leaving London to fight for their country; the aim being to keep them as safe as possible.

In April last year Yovi received a Facebook message - could she find accommodation locally for two Ukrainian boys and their mothers who had arrived at Stanstead to find that their intended housing arrangements had collapsed. She found spaces in Commonwood. Communicating in Russian, she took them shopping, helped them open bank accounts and got them residence permits. From then on Yovi and Colin provided continuing help.

On 1st February this year they went back to Bulgaria and got married. They also decided to make their home there. In this week before Easter they are packing their belongings, ready for the 1,800 mile drive. But they promise to return and see us. Yovi said "I love the village and the people here dearly, I shall miss the beautiful woods and our friends. Thank God for technology, we can keep in touch!"

Yovi and Colin leave you with this parting gift - learn how to use the app What3Words to pinpoint your front door (there is also a website www.what3words.com). Yovi had an experience where emergency services could not find her and a man in trouble when time was crucial. This app saved the man's life! What3Words is also used by delivery companies, as well as the emergency services who can find you even in a field. Test yourself - diary.areas.cared - what would you put in that box? Can't find it? Ask a techy youngster for help and it might save your life, or your food while still hot!

Goodbye Yovi and Colin, and thank you for all you have done to help everyone.

A loving husband, father, grandfather, uncle, great uncle, cousin, brother-in-law and loyal friend, Vic will be remembered as a kind and generous man, who always made you feel welcome with his warm and jovial nature.

He will be missed by all whose lives were privileged to have been touched by his.

Messy Church was started in the UK in 2004 in an Anglican church near Portsmouth and has grown into an international movement covering a wide range of Christian denominations and traditions. Messy church is open to all ages, young and old, and combines learning about Jesus by lively worship songs, prayers and bible teachings reinforced with imaginative and engaging crafts.

Why is it called Messy church? I quote, "We are all messy, our lives are not perfect, our families and children are not perfect and we believe the best space for God to deal with us in our messiness and disorder is in Church".

St Paul's and Holy Cross now jointly run Messy Church at least once during a school term, usually to celebrate a seasonal Christian theme. The children are all accompanied by a parent or



carer. It is held alternately in the Parish Room and Sarratt Village Hall from noon until 1.30pm.

A small team of creative volunteers put together three or four tables of craft work. With the help of the volunteers and their parents/carers the children are soon absorbed in using their imagination. At the last meeting the children were helped to make their own Easter garden and to make Easter cards. The



theme was 'Jesus is Alive' and a huge banner was painted by the children saying 'Jesus is Alive'. Other sessions have been about looking at God's creation and how we can do our part in looking after it, understanding God's love for us and how he wants us to live and behave to show that love to others. Finally, everyone sits down together to share and enjoy a hot lunch.

Do please look out for the date of the next Messy Church and come along; you do not have to bring a child with you. Come to enjoy the creativity and the friendship.

OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE SAVIOUR RC CHURCH

May is often associated with rebirth and new life, making it one of the most optimistic months of the year. We think of positive phrases such as 'you are as welcome as the flowers in May' and 'in the merry month of May.' The warmth and fragrances this month are a rejuvenating force, aren't they?

The church celebrates two uplifting feasts in May. Ascension Day on May 18th and Pentecost on May 28th. The Lord's Ascension, took place forty days after the Resurrection. The readings today describe the amazing event witnessed by the apostles. The Lord was taken up to Heaven to be at 'God's right hand.' His words to the apostles were 'and know that I am with you for all time' (Matthew 20:20). God had adopted a human body and nature in Jesus but by being human he was restricted in that he could only be in one place at any one time. He could only teach and care for those who were physically present there. Yet God's mission was to all people everywhere. No internet, TV or mobile phones back then. To deliver this, therefore, Jesus physically left this world but at the same time remained present by his Holy Spirit in and with his disciples and followers. He was no longer limited by earthly conditions.

Pentecost Sunday recounts the outpouring by the Holy Spirit on the apostles and Our Lady ten days after the Ascension of Jesus where they had gathered and prayed. This is traditionally considered the beginning of the Church, the birthday of the Church. In the readings for the day, we hear the extraordinary events of that first Pentecost. We see the effects that the Holy Spirit had on the life of the infant Church and in the lives of the apostles. They had a remarkable transformation - no longer fearful, but full of courage and eagerness, they went into the streets and told everyone about Christ, his teaching and what he had accomplished through his life, death and resurrection. We read how people of all nations and languages understood them. We, too, as followers of Christ, have been given a specific directive, namely, to carry his love and his message of salvation throughout the world. He calls us to be his hands, and feet, and voice. I am sure we all feel completely unworthy of the task (I know I struggle to write these articles!) but on the feast of Pentecost we ask for help as we say in our Gospel acclamation: "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love".

This year for the first time in 70 years we have a new monarch. The Coronation of King Charles III will take place on Saturday May 6th at Westminster Abbey, in a service rich with tradition and full of Christian symbols and values. May God bless His Majesty the King's and Her Majesty the Queen's reign.

Dilly, the bigger of my two ewes, lambed first, producing two little rams. She is the Beyoncé of the sheep world and has plenty of milk for her little mischiefs. Daisy had her twins, one of each, three days later. She is more like Twiggy and hers were smaller and for the first couple of days seemed to spend much longer feeding than Dilly's. I got worried that they weren't getting enough and tried to give them a bit extra from a bottle but they would hardly take any. They are doing OK; it just seems they have to work a bit harder to get their fill. Today Dilly's pair have been racing about and jumping on and off a tree stump, taking no notice of their mum when she called them. Daisy's had to learn about electric fencing; it's only a little tickle but enough to make them jump. I never count my lambs too soon; I worry about them until they are a month old, but so far so good, fingers crossed and touch wood!
