St Paul's School invests in the future

As you may have seen in Chipperfield News, we recently received a generous bequest from the late Maggie Prestwich to support and enrich our pupils' education, and we are now delighted to share how we will be using her donation.

Having reflected on what the school needs and what would have a big impact on our pupils, we will use some of the money to replace our sheltered hexagon on the school playground which has reached the end of its life. We need a space where children can meet friends, be social, perform and enhance their

lunchtime experience. Thank you to Mr Woods, Stephen Morrill and some of our parents who worked over a weekend to dismantle our existing shelter - we can't wait for the new one to be installed over half term!



We are also excited that the remainder of the bequest will be used to improve the school's computing and technology offer. From after half term, each child in Years 4, 5 and 6 will have access to their own Google Chromebook in class, giving them another form of instant support within the classroom to aid and develop their learning. Not only will the Chromebooks help with our pupils' achievements and educational innovation, it will also support pupils with their transition from primary school, as Google Education is used widely in many secondary schools. Our teachers recently had specialised training in using Google Drive, Google Classroom and accompanying applications. We are already considering how to use this effectively in the classroom, and I am looking forward to seeing them in action after half term.

School budgets are increasingly stretched, particularly in our school where we



have fewer than average pupils. So we are extremely thankful and appreciative of donations such as this. If anyone works in a large business or organisation that is looking to support the children of our future, please do contact me. Luke Varney, Headteacher

HEMEL HEMPSTEAD LOCAL GROUP

Meetings are normally held on the first Monday of each month at Chipperfield Village Hall, featuring a natural history talk, not necessarily just about birds.

Our next meeting is on **Monday, 3 March**, when our speaker will be **Paul Roper**, with a talk entitled **'Wildlife of the Lea Valley Park'**. Paul will describe the numerous nature reserves to be found in the nearby Lea Valley, home to a wide range of wildlife.

Doors open at 7.15pm, with the meeting starting at 7.45pm and finishing at around 9.45pm. As usual, there will be refreshments, raffle, displays of members' photographs, local news, and other activities.

Our next outing is a local trip on **Saturday, 22 March to RSPB Rainham Marsh, Essex.** This reserve is carefully managed by grazing cattle and by maintaining water levels to create a patchwork of clumpy wet grassland and semipermanent pools. This is the ideal habitat for marshland birds, such as lapwings and redshanks, as well as for wintering wildfowl, waders, some birds of prey, water voles, reptiles, and amphibians.

Anyone is welcome to attend the monthly meetings and outings, whether experienced or not. RSPB membership is not essential. There is no annual membership fee, but a small entry fee.

Poppy Appeal Final Accounts 2024

Once again, with Chipperfield and

Bovingdon villages working together, a staggering £12,105.25 has been raised so far, £1,879.28 up on 2023's total. We are hoping that a few hundred pounds more will be added to this amount once the RBL notify us of the amounts donated using the popular QR code.

Thank you to the Bovingdon volunteers who worked hard to achieve this result. Our thanks also go to all the hard workers of Chipperfield: 8 hardy door-to-door collectors (**Doris Yates** completing her 32nd year) who raised £884.29, the 39 table top collectors - and those who put up the gazebos and tables very early on two Saturday mornings who raised £2475.04, marginally up on 2023.

The village shops, pubs, churches, cafes and garage collected £1,229.35 (£309.86 up on 2023). St Paul's School raised £225.80 and the Church and D-Day collections totalled £456.25 and £315.52 respectively.

Thank you to all the village organisations who laid wreaths at the War Memorial and donated £650. Gift Aid added a further £326.75 to donations provided, which was much appreciated.

None of these figures would be available without the hours of work put in by **Mark Jarrad**, who produced sheets and sheets of detailed figures, with every penny accounted for. The RBL must be delighted on receiving the Chipperfield and Bovingdon accounts; little effort will be required from their team. Many, many thanks to Mark; I couldn't do my part without him.

Chipperfield Parish Council - March 2025

Chipperfield Parish Council (CPC) is investigating the need for additional posts along the edge of the Common near the Windmill pub in order to protect the grass opposite from further vehicular damage.

The Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace (SANG) officer from Dacorum Borough Council has recently been to the Common to assess the jobs required. He has now set up a joint working group with CPC and the Friends of Chipperfield Common to plan and prioritise works to be carried out under the SANG initiative. The working group has already had its first meeting and hopes to set some initial priorities and an action plan before the next edition of Chipperfield News. If anyone has any comments, concerns or suggestions regarding the ongoing management of the Common, please provide input/feedback via either CPC or the Friends of Chipperfield Common.





ST PAUL'S AND HOLY CROSS

We are so blessed in our villages to see the seasons change as we move into longer days and hopefully sunshine. However, unplanned things can happen. Floods, rain, snow and fire can cause worry, fear and concern to those journeying through.

We can be at a loss as to why these things occur and at their extreme nature - they can challenge our faith and beliefs, especially where we see suffering.

This month, as we journey into Lent's 40 days to Easter, it's a time to pause and reflect; possibly a time to fast, giving something up and using the time or cost for others. Some take courses at local churches, some decide to serve, some decide just to be still and listen; listen to the pulse of nature and breathe its air as it touches us. It can be different and so special.

Many of us at this stage will, I'm sure, be thinking, "Chance would be a fine thing!" Then I would suggest maybe your first prayer would be "Lord, give me some space". For some it's hard to be still, as our mind wanders on whom to call or what to tidy, and the general guilt

from being still and switching off can be a challenge.

John 15 v.16 reminds us that He chose us and not the other way round, meaning that He knows us fully...and our diaries!

Our church is open daily. Our beautiful footpaths and woods are there. Even our showers and bathrooms, the drive to work or to see friends, or that plot in the garden we escape to could be the places just to pause, to ask those "why" questions, or just to give thanks.

This year while at a conference, we looked at different types of prayer, of which one was repeating a bible verse, phrase or part of a song, such as "The Lord is my Shepherd", allowing the words to calm us as we repeated them or considered their meaning with our thoughts.

So, however you spend your Lent, why not ask God for a moment to pause and allow that moment to take us on a journey – a journey that may lead us to be thankful for the blessings and the moments we have.

OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE SAVIOUR RC CHURCH

A question that is often asked is: 'Why is Easter Sunday always moving - why can't the date be consistent?' Before we had calendars and clocks, we always had the moon. From the beginning, Passover - and the moon that affects its date - has influenced when Easter is celebrated. According to the Bible, Jesus shared a Jewish Pesach (Passover) meal shortly before his arrest and death. This meal is remembered as 'the Last Supper' on a day we now call Maundy Thursday. Way back in 325 AD, Roman Emperor Constantine organised a meeting, called the Council of Nicaea, where it was decided that the Church would mark Easter on the Sunday after the first full moon of the spring equinox (March 21). Therefore, Easter cannot fall earlier than March 22 or later than April 25. It's Emperor Constantine's fault! Lent is the period of six weeks (40 days not including Sundays) leading up to Easter. It commemorates the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert and being tempted by the devil. It begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on Wednesday, 5 March. They say the life of a Christian is a journey. Lent is a time for checking our 'sat nav' - a time for reflecting and seeing whether we are still on the right road, or whether we need to change direction and bring our lives more into line in the light of the example and teaching of Jesus. We know that the way we behave can affect other people. The season of Lent, with its three traditional practices - which are spelt out clearly in the Ash Wednesday Gospel reading from Matthew - is aimed precisely at checking all is working correctly and on moving us forward on our faith journey. To use the analogy of a car again, it's like booking in for the annual service to make sure everything is running smoothly. The practices of prayer, fasting (self-denial) and almsgiving (charity) are how we deepen our love of God and our neighbours. That may seem like hard work and undoubtedly, during these forty days and forty

nights, we will be tempted to give up. We can't help feeling selfish at times, but we should remove any pretence and be willing to look at ourselves critically to see if we need to change or improve anything. When the ashes themselves are given out on Ash Wednesday, the priest says: "Remember, you are dust, and to dust you will return" and then, when he marks the sign of the cross with the ashes on our foreheads, it is a stark reminder of our mortality. Death isn't something we like to think about, much less celebrate, is it? Yet those ashes go on in the shape of a cross for a reason. They remind us of the Cross of Jesus. They relate to both Good Friday and Easter morning. So, they point to His sacrifice and His infinite love for us. We can feel joyful. For God is with us – in the beginning, at the end, and all the years we live in between.
