Over the next few years I spent a small fortune on tools, baked endless cupcakes for my housemate, and watched countless YouTube tutorials. I soon retired from nursing and completed a PME Professional Diploma in Cake Decorating.



Today, my passion has grown into Cake & Create, where I run fun, friendly and relaxed cake-decorating workshops. Designed especially for beginners, the workshops provide a step by step guide from filling a piping bag to creating simple but beautiful cupcake decorations.

The workshops take place in the welcoming kitchen at Chipperfield Village Hall, where participants learn something new, enjoy a creative morning and leave with a box of stunning cupcakes to share.

Parish Council Update - April 2026

Dear Villagers,

With spring growth beginning, the SANG clearance work on the Common is really coming into its own; it has been gratifying to see ducks and even a heron on Apostles Pond. Regarding SANG, the next major works planned focus on the resurfacing of the easy access paths, which will hopefully benefit village young and old alike. Good news, too, that St Paul's School's nursery teacher is now a qualified woodland teacher and will be able to take children onto the Common.

Given villagers' ongoing traffic concerns, another really positive sighting is our new School Crossing Patrol Officer, appointed to monitor pedestrian crossing adjacent to The Cake Shack. Please offer her a big village welcome and take extra care to follow her guidance. Also regarding road safety, I'm pleased to report that the Council's funding request from the Herts Police and Crime Commissioner for two extra Speed Indicator Devices has been given initial approval. There are still some issues remaining, however, notably the related maintenance fees.

Whilst on funding, the Council has also responded to yet another DBC budget consultation regarding Council responsibilities in the village. The challenge here for the Council is managing the expectation that DBC funding for Chipperfield will be further cut in 2026/27. Once again, if you have any village matters to raise to the Council, do come and join us at one of our meetings, or else do contact Usha, our clerk. Meeting timings and agendas are on the Council noticeboard and website.

Finally, best wishes for the Easter holidays on behalf of all Council members.

Easter People in a Noisy World:

As the echoes of our Easter celebrations begin to settle, it is wonderful to look back on a beautiful season across our two villages. The energy and enthusiasm of the local schoolchildren during our Easter activities, alongside the deeply moving services across our parishes, have been a true blessing.

The stone has been rolled away, Christ is risen and, for a moment, all felt bright.

Yet, as we step out of the sanctuary and back into the rhythm of daily life, it is hard to ignore the heavy headlines. If I mentioned last year that the world seemed to be going mad, this year the outlook is looking decidedly gloomy. We find ourselves constantly bombarded by a stream of noise, conflict, and the endless clamour of big egos demanding our attention. It is a cultural climate that can easily leave us feeling weary, anxious, and small.

This year as we prepared for Easter in our churches, we met together to look at the ancient wisdom of the Desert Fathers and Mothers. These early Christians, living 300+ years after Christ, deliberately withdrew from the chaotic, status-driven society of their time, stepping instead into the quiet solitude of the desert. They didn't retreat simply to run away from life; they withdrew to find the time and space to be entirely still.

In that profound silence, they sought God's presence, cultivating a deep peace and a grounding humility that the noise of a chaotic world could not offer them, and yet amazingly, through their prayers and actions, they had a huge positive impact on the world they decided to withdraw from.

Today, in our little but beautiful part of the world, we may not have a physical desert to retreat to, but the wisdom they shared with others is the wisdom that is exactly what we need in order to be the positive encouragement towards each other.

As Christians we are often referred to as an Easter people. That means we are called to be a people of hope, even, and perhaps especially, when the world feels dark, as Christ was the ultimate reflection of hope, love and reconciliation.

Hope is not about pretending the gloom doesn't exist; it is about trusting that the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Perhaps, in a world dominated by loud voices and grand postures, just as it was for those of the early church, it is time for a different kind of uprising. It is time for ordinary, everyday folks: those of us who still have eyes to see the beauty of the world around us, the spring flowers and the birds returning, the small and sometimes random acts of kindness which enable us to carry the quiet flame of hope in our hearts, to rise up and spread a little more love.

We don't need to shout to make a difference. We can change the atmosphere of our villages through simple, everyday choices. Random acts of kindness, a gentle word spoken to a struggling neighbour, or a listening ear can pierce the gloom more effectively than we realise.

We can also create our own moments of "desert" stillness in the business of our lives right here. As we move through April, you are warmly invited to drop by St Paul's to tie a ribbon on the peace tree we have placed on our prayer table, or to step into the quiet sanctuary of Holy Cross to light a candle for a loved one. Take a moment to pause, reflect, and pray. Let us draw strength from the quiet presence of God, so that we can step back out into our villages with the quiet, unshakeable hope of Easter morning. For where there is hope there is love, and where there is love there is peace.

OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE SAVIOUR RC CHURCH

April Fool's Day is an annual occasion on the 1st of April which involves practical jokes and hoaxes, with the offenders shouting "April Fool!" at you afterwards. In more recent years more intricate tricks have occurred on the radio, TV and in newspapers. However, these jokes, whilst meant to be humorous, can actually lead to confusion and misinterpretations, can't they? This year April 1st actually falls on the Wednesday of Holy Week. Holy Week is central to Christianity because it honours the final week of Jesus Christ's life on earth, emphasising his message, sacrifice, death, and resurrection, which are the foundations of the Christian faith. In the Catholic church we call the end of Holy Week the Easter 'Triduum'. Taken from the Latin it means '3 days' and this refers to the 3 days before Easter Sunday - Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

Maundy Thursday is also known as the Last Supper as during the supper Jesus predicted that one of his disciples would betray Him. Jesus took some bread and wine, symbols of his body and blood, and he broke the bread as his body was about to be broken, and he shared the wine as his blood was about to be outpoured. He directed us to continue doing this in his memory which is now when the bread and wine are consecrated by the Priest during masses (the Eucharist). It was also the day of the Great Commandment: 'love one another as I have loved you'. Jesus also washed the feet of his disciples. This is a reminder that we have a commitment to serve and care for one another. Good Friday is a very solemn and sacred day as it remembers the day when Jesus Christ suffered and died on the cross for the salvation of humanity. We hear the passion of Christ which retells His suffering from the anguish in the Garden of Gethsemane to His last breath on the cross. The Easter Vigil is the official, liturgical start of Easter, held always after sunset on Holy Saturday. It is the first celebration of the Resurrection of Christ, marking the end of Lent and the Triduum. It is the longest service of the year! The Vigil is divided into four parts: The Liturgy of Light, The Liturgy of the Word, The Liturgy of Baptism and The Liturgy of the Eucharist. During the Liturgy of Light, the church is in

darkness and a fire is lit outside the church. The fire is blessed and the Easter candle is lit from it, with the priest saying: "May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds". The joyful message of the resurrection continues during masses on Easter Sunday. Jesus Christ suffered and died for our sins and rose on the third day. His victory over death and his promise of eternal life for all believers carries on. Christ is risen, Christ is present in our lives - Alleluia!

The congregation at OLMS is very sad to say that after Easter our lovely assistant priest Fr Dido is leaving us for Liverpool, where he will minister alongside Fr Paul Harris. We will really miss his kindness and sense of fun and wish him well. We are fortunate that Fr Patrick Musinga will now be joining Fr Richard as the assistant priest of the parish and we offer him a warm welcome. Happy Easter everyone.



Spring Has Sprung!

Spring arrived right on time, the first lovely day coming just as the weather man announced it was meteorological spring. After all the wet cloudy days it was a joy to take off my coat and appreciate the warm sunshine. I wasn't the only one to feel the benefit: two yellow brimstone butterflies were enjoying it as well. They are the first butterflies on the wing and a sure sign that winter is over. Later that day I spotted my first peacock butterfly of the year, freshly woken from its hiding place in my apple store.

The garden is now a blaze of yellow from all the daffodils that have suddenly opened, but my favourites are the little native wild ones that grow in the sheep paddocks: narcissus pseudonarcissus. My old mum called them 'lent lilies' and knew of a patch of them at Bedmond. They were really common up until late Victorian times when they went into a sharp decline. Now they have strongholds in Cumbria and the West Country but are rare in other places. I remember my husband telling me about ours when we were courting in 1980 but, when we went to look for them, they were overgrown with brambles and there was only one bloom. Now there are hundreds! Unlike the bigger hybrids, they set a lot of seeds and grow well from them, so every year I gather a few handfuls and take them to other

places in the sheep paddocks. Now we have little colonies in three different spots. As they are poisonous, the muntjac don't eat them, but I have seen the odd sheep with a bloom in its mouth, so I have to keep the sheep away from them for a few weeks.

I don't know why they've managed to survive here, but I am so glad they did and that I, like Wordsworth, can enjoy "a host of golden daffodils".

Owing to Easter Bank Holiday, our next meeting will be on **Monday, 13 April**, with a talk by **Ben Andrew** entitled '**British Wildlife Photography**'.

Ben is an award-winning wildlife photographer and will enchant us again with his wonderful shots of the birds and animals of the UK.

Doors open at **7.15pm**, with the meeting starting at **7.45pm** and finishing at around **9.45pm**. As usual, there will be refreshments, raffle, displays of members' photographs, local news, and other activities.

Our next outing is a car share trip on **Saturday, 18 April to Totternhoe and College Lake**.

Totternhoe is a less well known Wildlife Trust reserve located just to the west of Dunstable where spoil heaps from quarrying have developed into an impressive flower-rich grazed chalk grassland.

Large anthills attract the yellow meadow ant and in turn green woodpeckers to feed on the insects and larvae. Cowslips are the food plant of the scarce Duke of Burgundy caterpillar. It is also the best place in the county to spot the small blue butterfly, with hundreds to be seen in the early evening along the quarry edges. Additionally, a motte and bailey castle lies next to the reserve, its steep rampart slopes forming an impressive approach to the site. Anyone is welcome to attend the monthly meetings and outings, whether experienced or not. RSPB membership is not essential. There is no annual membership fee, but a small entry fee.
