Chipperfield Corinthians Lift the Cup!

This season is turning into an exceptional one for Chipperfield Corinthians, with results that have been unsurpassed for many years.

The first team played in the Herts Senior Centenary Trophy and were tasked with taking on Belstone, a team that is in the promotion play offs in the division above Chipperfield. The opening signs were edgy and Belstone took an early lead. The second half saw club legend Matt Chapman equalise from out wide with an incredible shot. The tide had turned and Chipperfield took control. Ten minutes from the end, after the ball had been scrambled away by the Belstone keeper and a header had hit the bar, the ball ran loose and was smashed home by local lad Freddie Lowe to give Chipperfield the trophy. Meanwhile, the battle for the HCL Premier League continues to twist and turn with 4 teams all in the hunt, including Chipperfield.

The league table shows that, if Chipperfield wins its games in hand, it will be top of the league. The team also has another final and semi-final to come, so an exciting finish to the season beckons, with the potential of 4 trophies up for grabs.

The reserves are continuing in excellent form this season. Their only league defeat was back in September, and they remain unbeaten at fortress Queen St over the last 12 months. If they win their game in hand, they will be one point off second place in the league. They have progressed well in the cups and have reached the Bingham Cox Final, which will be played later in April, and are also through to the Cecil Hudson Semi Final. As with the first team, there promises to be an exciting finish to the season, with the potential of 3 trophies to play for.

After a difficult first half of the season, the third team started 2026 in good form and currently sits in 5th position in its league.

Games are played every Saturday afternoon at Queen St with kick off now usually at 3.00pm - all support is very welcome.

This week, Archie reached another incredible milestone. He was selected as one of just 19 players in his age group from across the North, Midlands and South to train and

play together at St George's Park, the home of English Football.

Archie has had an amazing experience and represented himself brilliantly, both on and off the pitch. He continues to work incredibly hard, showing determination, resilience, and passion for the game. We are all so proud of him and can't wait to see what the future holds.

An Uncertain World

On 5th April, Christians across the globe celebrated Easter Sunday. Easter is the most significant of Christian festivals and, in a world where faith counts, religion seems to dominate amid claims and counter-claims regarding the question 'Whose side is God on?'

Unlike statues erected in some countries of men holding guns, cannons and flags, this memorial consisted of a very simple sculpture of a naked man clinging to a cross. It stopped me in my tracks and made me ask the question again: 'Whose side is God on?'

Most of us are unable to affect global situations, yet we can do something. We can demonstrate our faith through love, kindness and generosity: to our families, to our friends, to our neighbours and, most important of all, to strangers.

The Christian faith suggests that our relationship with God should be modelled on the life lived by Jesus, and it is important in these uncertain times that we make even more of an effort to reach out to those struggling in mind, body and spirit.

So, as we move further into this uncertain year, let us be encouraged to step out in faith, to reach out and touch others' lives.

OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE SAVIOUR RC CHURCH

May is a favourite month of mine. The days are longer and hopefully warmer, and the garden is really growing and filling with flowers. I feel a bit more energetic after the cold and very wet winter months too. Easter Sunday fell on 5th April this year and, as I gave up chocolate for Lent, I am free now to indulge when I wish! Bliss! During May the church celebrates two major feasts. This year Ascension Day falls on May 14th - the 40th day after Easter - and it marks the bodily ascension of Jesus into heaven. Pentecost honours the day that the Holy Spirit descended on and empowered the disciples, which is often considered the birth of the Christian Church. This is on the 50th day after Easter - May 24th. As we reflect on Ascension Day, we know how God had assumed a human body and nature in Jesus Christ, and he was therefore restricted in that he could only be in one place at one time. Yet His mission was to all people, of all nations and of all times. To achieve and accomplish this, Jesus physically left this world by ascending into heaven, but at the same time remained present by his Holy Spirit in and with his disciples. After his resurrection, he had appeared to the disciples many times. He told them (Acts 1:8) "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you and you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth". In the gospel of Matthew 28: 18-20 we read that before he ascended "Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And look, I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'

The apostles returned to Jerusalem after Jesus' ascension and gathered in the Upper Room where they had celebrated the Last Supper with him. On that first Pentecost Sunday we read (Acts 2, 1-4) that "suddenly there came from heaven a sound as of a powerful wind which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and there appeared to them like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak different languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech." What a remarkable transformation in the apostles - no longer fearful, but full of courage and passion, they went into the streets and told everyone about Jesus, his teaching and what he achieved through his life, death and resurrection. The presence of the Holy Spirit gave them the courage, the energy, the inspiration to do their work. People of all nations and languages understood them.

We pray that at Pentecost the Holy Spirit may bring peace and unity to our world.

Where Have All My Frogs Gone?

Over the last few years the amount of frog spawn in my big wildlife pond has been getting less and less. At one time an area as big as a double bed would be covered in spawn, but this year there are only 3 clumps. Most small ponds are either frog ponds or toad ponds, but mine was big enough to have toads on the right and frogs on the left. The toads are still coming, but there are hardly any frogs. I usually see quite a few frogs squashed in the lane, but I only noticed one this year. So what has happened to them?

There is a nasty virus called Ranavirus that has become more prevalent in the last few years. The frogs get ulcers and their legs turn red. I have seen at least one like that in the garden, but I thought the virus could infect toads as well.

Or could it be my old foe the Heron? Most mornings when I pull back the curtains and look down to the pond, a heron is there. Tom and I chase him off as we go for our first walk. The herons seem to be getting bolder as they are now coming to the formal pond on my patio. Last year I got a photo of one just outside the window! There seem to be more of them about. I'm told that the Heronery in St Albans Park is flourishing, and that's within easy flying distance. They are quite keen to take my newts as well, but I can still see a lot of those in the pond.

With wildlife there are always winners and losers, but I prefer the frogs; they eat the slugs in my garden and don't leave slimy white poo on my patio!
